Chapter Projects

Gamma Alpha Chapter makes a difference in the community:

- Gamma Alpha an annual auction each year.
 The proceeds of the auction are used to support our Grant-in-Aid for early career educators, Schools for Africa, and community projects.
- Gamma Alpha members volunteer time and money at Seedlings Braille Books for Children and work closely with the founder of this non-profit organization.
- Beverly Group Home for Girls is a service project for Gamma Alpha. Donations are made to enhance the girls' lives while at the group home.
- Another project is the Teen Mom & Baby Program. Teen mothers, ages 14-17 who are either pregnant or have a child ages birth to 3 years old receive one-on-one counseling and parenting mentorship in a structured, community environment.
