Speaker: Kids 4 Afghan Kids Update

Teaching students about diversity and the world around them can be a difficult task for educators. Northville teacher, Khris Nedam, and her sixth grade students took a unique approach in learning about Afghanistan. Her students discovered that the country had suffered a long drought, economic disruption due to the Soviet Union invasion, the Taliban rule, and the recent war. Students learned that children in many rural parts of Afghanistan had not had a school or access to a doctor in over 20 years. After understanding the hardships of Afghan children, Mrs. Nedam's students decided to be proactive and Kids 4 Afghan Kids was born. Under the guidance of their students raised money and witnessed, via teacher, the videotapes, internet and cell phones, the construction of a sixroom school, a medical clinic, an orphanage, a bakery/kitchen, a guest house and community well for the residents of Wonkhai Valley, a mountainous area 3 hours southwest of Kabul. Come and be inspired by this unique and ongoing Social Studies project. Khris presented this session at the State Convention and for us last year. This is a review and update of the project. SBCEU



Statistics from DKG membership database show that new members (no matter their years in education) drop out of the Society at about the same rate that new educators drop out of the profession - we lose approximately 50% by year three of their membership. With this data in hand, the 2010-2012 International Membership Committee has chosen to concentrate, not on a new membership challenge, but on rewriting existing resources and creating new resources that will assist chapters in better orienting new reorienting members and all members.
