This summer Lisa Austin, Pam Husson & Amy Wright visited this "Italian Wonderland" of all things tasty and delicious!

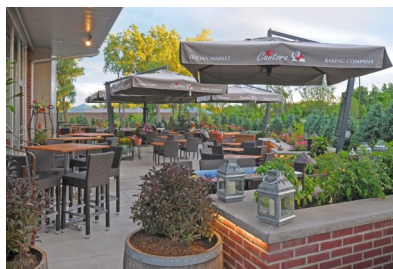
We gleefully ordered from the deli counter,

Meeting Minutes September 22, 2016

The meeting was called to order by Colleen at 5:56. Introductions were made: Co-presidents, Amy and Colleen, Marcia Scarr (DKG's first president), and Linda Clark (friend of Lynn).

Presidents' Reports – Judi Fisher reminded everyone that she still needs more volunteers for the Fall Conference in Livonia (Oct. 21-22). Hours begin at 2pm on Friday and 7 a.m. on Saturday. You need to register for the conference before you can volunteer to help. Donations are still needed for the Gift Certificate basket we will be donating. Cash will be accepted but be sure to indicate to Cindy your check is for the Fall Conference basket.

Treasurer's report – Cindy reviewed our current balance and expenses and reminded everyone to pay our dues of \$75 as soon as possible.

Holiday Auction – Mary Jo reminded everyone that the date has been changed to Sunday, November 6. Members should have already received flyers in the first bulletin. Checks need to be sent to Cindy by Oct. 17. She reminded us to be sure to indicate the meal choice. We will assign jobs as we have done in the past based on who will be attending but if you would like to do a different job please let Mary Jo know. Since the event is in November, donated items to auction need not be holiday themed. Colleen reminded us that this is our big fundraiser so participation is very important. We will be donating to Seedlings in place of table favors (although Lisa mentioned that she may make something small to put on the tables.) A decision was made to change the name of this auction to DKG Annual Auction.

Corresponding Secretary report – Let Amy know if you're not receiving the bulletin. She will attach other items as PDF files rather than including them in the bulletin. Lynn reported that we'll be getting less *Wolverines* each year because they're leaning toward electronic rather than paper. Colleen and Amy will be sharing our documents via google drive. If anyone needs help with this let them know and they're very willing to help. Colleen made corrections to our list of officers and committees to include Lisa Austin (Sunshine), Donna Colaianne and Joanna Eiwen (50/50), Book Lady (Carol Palk). Lisa volunteered to put together a gift basket of small items. Bring any small item to the October meeting and give it to her.

Grant-in-aid – Donna read a thank you note from Hollie Mabbott, our last recipient. She is a kindergarten teacher who used the money for an area rug for her classroom, tubs for her students, and supplies for her classroom.

Service Projects – Judy Morante reported that Kathleen Washington will be our guest speaker at the October meeting. Bring any ideas for the girls from Beverly House to this meeting. She reported that the Sumpter House baby shower was a success. All girls were very grateful. Lynn will help Judy with Beverly House and may ask for the Wilma Adams grant again. A discussion included whether or not to help support a student from Wayne High who is in a very difficult family situation. Judy will speak to the counselor and give an update at our next meeting. It was suggested to have a theme for donations each month to help out this particular family so in October the theme be paper products. (Judy strongly suggested toilet paper).

Old Business – Amy asked members to first put DKG in subject area when sending an email to either her or Colleen. A reminder that Metro Council's theme is Spring Gardening and will follow the same format as in the past. It will take place at Our Lady of Sorrows in Farmington. The birthday dinner will again be at Courthouse Grill in Plymouth. We discussed the order of our meetings and decided to follow this order: dinner, speaker (usually around 6 p.m.), business meeting. The vacation auction was concluded and the meeting was adjourned at 7:06 p.m.
