MINUTES - FEBRUARY 8, 1984 MEETING

The meeting was called to order by President Joan Lyon at 9:20 p.m. following the program on sexism presented in textbooks and other educational materials by Grace Kochnaturoff. Barbara Broadley corrected the minutes from the November 2, 1983 meeting to include the decision to terminate the membership of Sue Byspinski and Julie Nichols if dues are not paid by December 1.

B. Broadley made some introductory remarks, and members nominating prospective members introduced these guests. Grace Morgan talked about the iniation fee and dues.
