Executive Board Meeting  
Wednesday, Nov. 2, 1983, 7:00 p.m.

Brought to order by President Joan Lyon.

The official count of active members stands at 30. Georganne Denis has transferred membership to a Toronto branch of DKG. New potential members will be invited to the Nov. 16th auction and Jan. 11th seminar with Ken Johnson. New orientation for candidates is Feb. 8th at Elliot School library. The time of the meeting is 7:30. There will be some discussion describing our group and its' purposes. *Julie Nichols & Suzanne Bacinski have been dropped for non-payments*  
Discussion debated limiting membership to Westland and Livonia. Consensus of the group was that the name and description of geographic boundaries for membership remain the same. No membership rule needed amending.

Budget was presented by Grace Morgan. The motion was made to approve the budget by Clare Howell and seconded by Carol Holland. The total budget was approved unanimously.

Grace Morgan made the motion that the Key pin be given at initiation due to changes in procedure for purchasing. Gamma Alpha will pre-purchase the pins before the April initiation. This will be reimbursed by the new members as they pay their dues and fees. Marcia Scarr seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Correspondence included notification that Kathryn Walker is now N.E. regional director. Paula Dent, State President, recommended large expansion efforts for all groups. Regional workshops will be at Battle Creek and Gaylord. There will be an official flag at State functions. Two new awards will be given at the State convention to men or women who have supported education through a type of public work within the business, political, or private sector.

Nominations for chapter officers for the next bienium are as follows: President, Barb Broadley; First Vice-President and Program Chairperson, Pat Laarman; Second Vice-President and Membership Chairperson, Fran Saenz; Recording Secretary, Georgie Watson; and Corresponding Secretary, Debbie Ervin.

Barb Broadley made the motion that the chapter minutes be bound by a looseleaf binder and separated by each bienium. This was seconded by Esther Loskowske and carried.

The exchange student, if Alpha Iota State sponsors one at U. of M. or M.S.U., will be invited to the program. The theme may revolve around the student's country. World Fellowship chairpersons, Esther Loskowske and Sandy Becher, will invite the exchange student as their committee is the sponsor for that evening.

World Fellowship chairpersons were directed to reciprocate a Christmas gift of last year with a typical American Christmas tree ornament to Astrid Lyndgrunz.

## MINUTES - FEBRUARY 8, 1984 MEETING

### Gamma Alpha

The meeting was called to order by President Joan Lyon at 9:20 p.m. following the program on sexism presented in textbooks and other educational materials by Grace Kochnaturoff. Barbara Broadley corrected the minutes from the November 2, 1983 meeting to include the decision to terminate the membership of Sue Bysinski and Julie Nichols if dues are not paid by December 1.

B. Broadley made some introductory remarks, and members nominating prospective members introduced these guests. Grace Morgan talked about the initiation fee and dues. The total for a new member will be \$85.00 which includes initiation, pin, next years dues, handbook and constitution. Joan Lyon explained the purpose of the organization and Marcia Scarr reviewed the history of the Gamma Alpha Chapter. Fran Saenz described the Program of Work and the various publications developed at local, state, national and international level. Alice Marks described the symbol, and Barbara Broadley emphasized the importance of commitment to the chapter which in turn can effect action at other levels (example: we nominated current State President, Paula Dent). At this point the agenda was amended and J. Lyon informed the group that Sue Bysinski was requesting that she be reinstated. Simone Grzesik made the motion to reinstate Sue seconded by Irene Finkbeiner, and approval was unanimous.

Kay Diggs moved that the January 11 minutes be approved as written, seconded by B. Broadley and approved.

Grace Morgan gave the treasurer's report. Present balance is \$1,372.37.

Copies of the chapter standing rules were distributed, and Simone Grzesik described the procedure used in writing them. These rules will be voted on at the next meeting (brief business meeting beginning at 5:30 p.m. March 14 prior to International Night at Lowell Middle School), and submitted to the state organization by April 1.

Clare Howell nominated June Randall, seconded by Harriet Larson, for the chapter's nominee for Distinguished Service Award - the motion was approved.

A form for jewelry orders was circulated. It will be held until next month to give new members an opportunity to select.



Joan Lyon called attention to an upcoming Brain Dominance Seminar being co-sponsored by another Delta Kappa Gamma Chapter and other organizations.

Marcia Scarr discussed the program agenda and distributed the menu of the March 14 International Night. A check for \$10.00 to Gamma Alpha for the dinner is due to Grace Morgan by February 22. Kay Diggs proposed that our group share the cost for the speakers with Gamma Gamma. Irene Finkbeiner seconded the motion, and it was approved to contribute \$37.50 for this purpose.

Evelyn Shuput reported that the location for the April 14 Birthday Luncheon is not yet determined. Details will be mailed later.

Barbara Broadley thanked the group in advance for their support for the next years as she serves as President.

Upon Abby Roche's inquiry, Marcia Scarr moved, seconded by Fran Saenz, that a \$75.00 stipend be offered to the speaker for the May meeting. The motion was approved.
