Gamma Alpha Executive Board Meeting

Call to order at 4:35.

December minutes were reviewed. Motion to accept was made by Barb, seconded by Judi. Approved. Thanks were again expressed to all members who donated items and brought guests. The money earned was the direct result of the many fine donations and the number of guests. Many compliments were offered regarding the location, as well. A big thanks to the committee chair and committee members.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Savings account has \$5493.85. Checking account has \$705.20. (\$41.00 in checking will go toward Joan Lyon's dues.) It is noted that having the newsletter on line is saving money. The much lower cost of printing the yearbook (researched by Judi Fischer) has saved money as well.

CORRESPONDENCE: A letter was received from Lutheran Social Services thanking the chapter for the stockings filled and donated to Wayne County Family Center.

A card of thanks was sent from the family of Elizabeth Williams for condolences on the event of her passing.

COMMITTEES resignate printed but some standard control is to strength

MEMBERSHIP: Amy reported that chapter attendance in September was 50%, October attendance was 44%, November attendance was 72% and December attendance was 66%. Average attendance = 58%. Current chapter membership is 33.

Concern about low membership number was discussed. All are encouraged to invite new members and to encourage attendance at all meetings. Some meetings should be designated as meetings to bring guests and some meetings to discuss chapter issues. The honor of membership should be stressed. Activities and programming should be reviewed for meeting the interests and concerns of all members, including younger teachers. It was suggested that initiation take place at a multi-chapter function so that many new members are part of a bigger program. Honors such as Member of Distinction may be presented at multi-chapter functions, as well.

NOMINATIONS: Chair is needed.

PERSONAL GROWTH: Barb will have Gamma Alpha Friend of Education certificates for Deborah Bondy of Seedlings and chef Larry Janes. The two honorees will be invited to the chapter birthday dinner for presentations of the awards.
