Congratulations also to our new slate of officers. Let's do everything we can to help them.

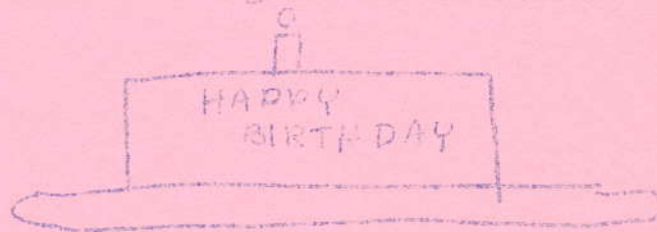
