Our first meeting of the year held at the Eagle's Nest was a success thanks to the personal efforts of Harriet Larson, Grace Morgan, Barb Broadley, Sherry Green Shirley Wahlstrom, and Carol (C.R.S.) Holland. First, the jewelry sale brought in some needed funds and lifted our spirits. Then thirty-one of us shared an "interesting" meal with second helpings of friendliness. At our business meeting committees reported that plans were well underway for all our chapter's upcoming activities. Thanks to Suzanne Basinski (Empathy), and Alice Marks (World Fellowship), our committees are now all chaired. Our Scholarship Committee came up with a fine plan, and thanks to their effort, our chapter will soon be awarding its first grants in aid or scholarship.

Last weekend, Harriet Larson, Georgie Watson and I were in Port Huron to attend the Fall Executive Board and Workshops. Thanks to Georgie and Harriet, we were able to cover all the meetings. The Thomas Edison Inn, where we stayed, gets the Gamma Alpha seal of approval for attractive accomadations. It is located at the foot of the Blue Water Bridge and affords a nice view of passing ships on the St. Clair River.

In our Executive Board, one old chapter was disolved (Alpha Iota). It was reported that its membership had dwindled and that no one was willing to take the leadership. In contrast, untrecently formed new chapter, (Chi) from the U.P. was introduced. Other business included a plea for financial support (\$5) per member, to support the upcoming NE Regional in Grand Rapids. Knowing the negative feelings of the majority of our members towards the political and social activities of the Amway ownership, I did not enlist Gamma Alpha to financially or physically support the Convention. Delta Kappa Gamma Gamma Alpha Chapter Business Meeting September 21, 1988

- I. The meeting was called to order at 7:40 p.m. by President Fran Saenz.
- II. Roll call was taken by Carol Holland.
- III. Minutes were approved after the following corrections:
 - 1. Correct spelling: Dr. Helen Suchara
 - 2. The Executive Board accepted the resignation of Irene Finkbeiner at the June meeting.
 - 3. Clare Howell is also a member of the Scholarship and Special Projects Committee.
 - IV. Treasurer Grace Morgan reported that eleven members still owe dues.
 - V. Kay Diggs presented the proposed Chapter Budget for 1988-89. It was explained that the purpose of the contingency fund was to have money available when necessary. Georgie used having to pay for the charter bus to Mackinac Island before money could be collected as an example. Kay pointed out that our proposed income of \$1,352.66 could be met by our fund raiser, an assessment, or both.

A motion was made and carried to accept the budget.

- VI. Alice Marks volunteered to chair the World Fellowship Committee. They will come up with ways to raise money to send to International Fellowship for such things as scholarships around the world and bringing students to the United States. A quarter was collected from anyone not wearing their pin.
- VII. Suzanne Bacinski volunteered to chair the Empathy Committee. Clare Howell explained that the purpose of the committee was to send flowers, cards, or gifts when appropriate. Members are asked to notify the committee when illness, death, or happier events occur.
- VIII. Gamma Alpha accepted the resignation of Pat Hammond, whose job responsibilities make her unable to attend meetings.

IX. Committee Reports

- A. Membership: Carol reminded us to be thinking of new members for the January meeting as the names must be presented and voted on at that time. There is no limit to the number of new members that can be accepted.
- B. Program Chairman Sherry Green provided members with a handout showing all committees, and said that many committees are already under way with plans for the year. She referred to this year as one of recommitment to Gamma Alpha. Those present agreed that the place cards were a great idea.

- C. The Yearbook Committee is updating their information. Please inform them of any changes. Sandy Becher said their goal is to have an updated yearbook, including the new members, ready for the Birthday Dinner in May.
- D. Legislation: Pat Laarman reported that the flyers were ready for the Legislative Meeting on October 12. The meeting is open to the public. It will be held at the Livonia Civic Center Library Auditorium. Lyn Bankes and Justine Barns will speak on women's issues and educational legislation.
- E. Harriet Larson presented the committee's proposal for Scholarship/
 Grants-In-Aid. Copies of the proposal and application form were
 given to members. Sherry Green commended the committee for doing
 an excellent job. Alice Marks moved that the proposal be approved.
 Georgie seconded and the motion carried.

Barb Broadley and Lynn Ross were added to the screening committee.

There is \$744.16 in the fund, enough for three \$250.00 scholarships or grants. Discussion centered on whether the fund should be replenished when depleted, and if so, how. Members felt it should be continued, and suggestions were a fund raiser or assessment.

F. Seminar: Mayflower Meeting House, March 18, Brunch

Doreen Reid presented the topic <u>Women Alone</u>. Nickie McWhirter was contacted through Alice Marks, and is available at a cost of \$750. Discussion centered on the cost and her style. A break-down of the cost was presented by Adele Sobania. Ticket prices would range from approximately \$15.00 if 200 tickets were sold to \$18.00 if 100 tickets were sold. It was brought up that the seminar was set up as a community service, and Nickie McWhirter might be more entertaining than informative. Pat Laarman suggested that McWhirter could probably create an awareness of a serious topic rather than having the answers. It was felt by others that McWhirter would draw a larger number of people to the seminar.

A motion was made by Marie Canzoneri and seconded by Mary Breen that Nickie McWhirter be invited to speak at the seminar. The motion carried.

Because the cost required support by all members, the following motion was made by Joan Fredericks: We all pledge that our entire membership attempt to reach the goal of selling 200 tickets. The motion was seconded by Sandy Becher, and carried.


