What Are We Reading?

The Marriage Portrait

By Maggie O'Farrell

Hamnet's author, Maggie O'Farrell, has written s novel that pulled me in from the very first page. The Marriage Portrait is a beautifully written historical novel that reimagines the life of Lucrezia de' Medici, a young Renaissance woman who marries Duke Alfonso II d'Este of Ferrara, and finds herself in a dangerous situation after her arrival at court. Lucrezia is the duchess whose story inspired Robert Browning's poem "My Last Duchess." O'Farrell's writing vividly capturing 16th century Italy while giving voice to a young woman silenced by history. The novel explores themes of autonomy, power, and the constraints placed on women in patriarchal societies, all through Lucrezia's perspective. O'Farrell brings her to life with such vivid detail that you can almost feel the brushstrokes of Lucrezia's world...the art, the palaces, the quiet tension of a life not truly her own.

I think that you will appreciate Lucrezia's artistic spirit and intelligence, as well as O'Farrell's emphasis on the transformative power of learning and observation. It's a story that invites reflection on how women's agency, education, and empathy shape both history and the classroom today. For women teachers, this book resonates on another level. Lucrezia's curiosity and independent spirit mirror what we try to inspire in our students every day. It's a reminder of the importance of nurturing imagination and giving young people, especially girls, the space to find and use their voices.

A Reese Witherspoon Book Club pick, *The Marriage Portrait* is a beautifully written, emotionally rich, and it leaves you thinking about how women's stories, once lost to history, still have so much to teach us.



Should More Time Be Spent Learning Math Facts

This is a brief summary of an article from <u>Edutopia</u> by Holly Korbey. The link to the full article is below.

As math scores decline nationwide, educators are revisiting the importance of mastering basic math facts through consistent practice. Research and classroom results, such as those from Forest Hills Elementary in Pennsylvania using the SpringMath program, show that short, focused sessions on foundational skills like multiplication and division improve both fluency and confidence. Experts argue that while conceptual understanding is important, students also need repeated, explicit practice to build automatic recall and free up working memory for complex problem-solving. Evidence-based strategies such as spaced interleaved practice can strengthen long-term retention without relying on endless drills. The article concludes that balancing fluency and conceptual learning-and giving time for daily foundational practice-is key to reversing declining math achievement.
